CAMERON FERGUSON

Candidate for President



Jerry Wojcik

Jerry Wojcik is running for Member-at-Large on the Board of Governors. He joined the CCBCC about six years ago after acquiring a 1974 Triumph TR6. Years earlier, he owned a "basket case" MGA but never finished restoring it. Now when the TR6 needs work, he does as much as possible himself, largely because he learns more about his car almost each time. Jerry spent 40 years as a structural engineer with extensive experience in the nuclear field. He and his wife Ellen live in East Sandwich, and enjoy meeting new people and discovering new places at club events. Jerry is a member and past officer of the Cape Cod Classics Car Club, and is active in its "tool-

ship" award program for students at Upper Cape Cod Regional Technical School and at Cape Cod Tech. He also periodically brings lesser-known "cars of interest" to the schools for students and instructors to examine. One of them is his rare 1963 Pontiac LeMans, created by the fabled John DeLorean right after he became Pontiac's chief engineer. Independent rear suspension and a rear-mounted transmission, connected to the front engine by a long driveshaft, yielded ideal 50/50 weight distribution and improved handling. But GM soon abandoned the concept because it was complicated and unprofitable. DeLorean followed up with the 1964 GTO — and a lot more.
